Thank you for your Freedom of Information request of 14 April 2025. We are responding to you under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

#### FOI REQUEST (14 April 2025)

  - (c) Future delivery of services at Hawick Business Centre.
- 7. A copy of the current strategic partnership agreement between Scottish Borders Council and SOSE for the delivery of activity at Hawick Business Centre.
- 8. Any monitoring or performance reports related to the delivery of services at the centre during the 2024/25 financial year.

#### **FOI RESPONSE**

- 1. The scope, terms of reference, and methodology for the evaluation is attached (Appendix A).
- 2. Frontline is the name of the appointed consultant
- 3. The expected timeline for publishing is May 2025.
- 4. In regard to providing SOSE's funding application to the UKPF, we apply FOISA section 33(1)(b) substantial prejudice to commercial interests where disclosure would (or would be likely to) prejudice substantially the commercial interests of any person or organisation including a public authority, company and partnership.

The use of this exemption requires SOSE to consider the public interest in both disclosing and not disclosing the information, and in this case, it has been decided the public interest is in withholding the application. SOSE would not want to prejudice substantially its commercial position by disclosing information.

- 5. SOSE was not involved in the criteria or framework for applications for funding. We therefore apply Section 17(1) of FOISA to notify you that we do not hold the information you requested.
- 6. Correspondences, briefing or meetings notes:
  - a. The funding application attached (Appendix B)
  - b. The ongoing evaluation there is no ongoing evaluation
  - c. Future delivery of services -attached (Appendix B)

We have applied Exemption 38(1)(b) - Personal Data - to questions 6(a) and 6(b). Personal information such as names or email addresses have been redacted. SOSE is satisfied that this information constitutes 'personal data' and it would therefore be unlawful to disclose it. Exemption 38(1)(b) is an absolute exemption, so there is no requirement to consider the public interest in the application of this exemption.

# PROPOSED STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIP PROTOCOL BETWEEN SCOTTISH BORDERS COUNCIL AND SOUTH OF SCOTLAND ENTERPRISE

#### SCOTTISH BORDERS COUNCIL

#### **26 November 2020**

#### 1 PURPOSE AND SUMMARY

- 1.1 This report proposes that Scottish Borders Council enters into a Strategic Partnership Protocol with South of Scotland Enterprise (SOSE) to assist both bodies to work collaboratively together to achieve their joint aims and for the benefit of the economy in the area.
- 1.2 South of Scotland Enterprise formally commenced its operations on the 1<sup>st</sup> of April 2020. Its creation represents a major change in the in the economic development landscape across the South of Scotland and offers opportunities to take different and innovative approaches to the delivery economic development across the South of Scotland.
- 1.3 Scottish Borders Council retains economic development amongst its functions and it is considered vital that both bodies work together in a collaborative way to achieve their joint aims. In recent years, SBC has entered into partnership protocols with its strategic partners such as Live Borders and CGI. As this has proved to be an effective tool, it is considered that it would be helpful and consistent with that approach to enter into such a protocol with the new Agency.

#### 2 RECOMMENDATIONS

2.1 I recommend that approval is given to enter into a Strategic Partnership Protocol with South of Scotland Enterprise in the terms detailed in the Appendix to this report.

#### 3 BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE

- 3.1 The South of Scotland Enterprise Act 2019 established the South of Scotland Enterprise (SOSE). Its formal operations commenced on 1 April 2020 and the Act provides that its aims are to:
  - a) further the sustainable economic and social development of the South of Scotland, and
  - b) improve the amenity and environment of the South of Scotland
- 3.2 It is recognised that one of the most critical factors for the effective operation of SOSE will be its relationships with the two Local Authorities within its areas.
- 3.3 Scottish Borders Council retains the function of economic development amongst its responsibilities and is committed to working with the Agency to achieve our mutual aims including, of course, the Regional Economic Strategy. The new Agency is therefore very much a strategic partner of the Council. This reflected in SOSE being a new statutory partner in the Community Planning Partnership
- 3.4 In recent years the Council has chosen to enter into partnership protocols with its strategic partners such as Live Borders and CGI. The purpose of those protocols is to set out the rules of engagement between the two organisations; to establish and commit to working collaboratively together in a mutually supportive way to ensure that strategic aims and goals are met. It is considered that it would be appropriate and consistent to enter into such a protocol with this newly created and important strategic partner.
- 3.5 The Appendix to this report contains a proposed Strategic Partnership Protocol. The Protocol details the aims of the Strategic Partnership and the commitment from both parties for working together in such a way as to maximise the benefit for the Scottish Borders. It is considered that this is an appropriate basis to establish a relationship with the Agency.

#### 4 IMPLICATIONS

#### 4.1 Financial

There are no financial implications arising out of the recommendations in this report.

#### 4.2 **Risk & Mitigations**

There is a risk that if the recommendations in this report are not agreed, an opportunity to strengthen the relationship with a key strategic partner will be lost.

- (9) Give an early warning to the other Party of any matter that they become aware of that could affect the achievement of any shared aim;

- (11) Co-locate personnel wherever practicable to maximise communication, collaboration and deep business understanding at all levels.

Hawick Business Centre opened on 18 April, with a range of business and community representatives attending the open day. The accelerator programme has started with 8 businesses registering who have growth aspirations, bringing the cohort together to learn, connect and share knowledge. This 3-month programme will run until end of July 2024 and the 2<sup>nd</sup> cohort of the programme is scheduled to start in September.

The Business Centre is starting to build momentum, up to 30 June 2024 we have held 14 events ranging from 1-1 expert support sessions, Al for business, techscaler unplugged, adviser drop-in sessions and podcasting. Local businesses and organisations have started using the centre as a meeting place as well as hot desking. The Business Centre has welcomed 240 visitors to the centre since the Launch.

The Business Centre has held several partners hosting events including Borders Chamber, Business Gateway and the South of Scotland Enterprise aimed at supporting businesses in the region.

The Business Centre has been welcomed by both business the community in Scottish Borders and there is a real buzz around the town.
