- 3. Please could you provide me with any SOSE correspondence with Ministers, ministries or other Scottish Government agency in respect of the funding for the GSA Biosphere.

RESPONSE

Question 1: The responses to the consultation on the proposed Galloway National Park will be published by NatureScot and in the public domain, this will include SOSE's response. We therefore apply section 27 of FOISA (information intended for future publication). This exempts information from disclosure if an authority, or third party, plans to publish the information no later than 12 weeks after the date the request is made. This exemption is subject to the 'public interest test'. We have considered if the public interest in disclosing the information outweighs the public interest in applying the exemption. We have found that, on balance, the public interest lies in favour of upholding the exemption. We understand that there may be some public interest in sharing SOSE's consultation response, however, this will be met when it is published along with all consultation responses. In the meantime, this allows all responses to be collated and checked before they are published at the same time.

Question 2: The information you have requested is provided in Appendix A.

Question 3: The information you have requested is provided in Appendix B.

FOISA exemptions have been applied to some of the information you requested. Information on these exemptions is available below.

- Section 38(1)(b)- personal information
- Some of the information has been redacted as the information constitutes personal data under data protection laws and to disclosure the information would breach one or more of the data protection principles. This is an absolute exemption and does not require consideration of the public interest.
- Section 29(1)(a) formulation or development of government policy

 Some information has not been shared because it relates to the ongoing development of

 Scottish Government's proposal for a new national park to be established in Galloway.

 Scottish Government commissioned NatureScot to develop and consult on the detailed

 arrangements for the proposed National Park. This exemption is subject to the 'public

 interest test'. We have considered if the public interest in disclosing the information

 outweighs the public interest in applying the exemption and we have found on this

 occasion that the public interest lies in favour of upholding the exemption. It is in the

 public interest to allow officials and Scottish Ministers to be able to discuss and debate

 the development and formulation of the national park proposal and consultation process.
- Section 30(b)(ii) -free and frank exchange of views

Some information has not been shared because disclosure would, or would be likely to, inhibit substantially the free and frank exchange of views and discussion for the purpose of discussion and deliberation. This exemption is subject to the 'public interest test'. We have considered if the public interest in disclosing the information outweighs the public interest in applying the exemption. SOSE recognises there is a public interest in disclosing information as part of being an open and transparent public body. However, on this occasion we have found that the public interest lies in favour of upholding the exemption. There is a greater public interest in allowing a private space which officials and Ministers can communicate with external stakeholders as part of the process of discussion, opinion and deliberation. This private space is essential so that views can be freely shared without scrutiny.

You have the right to request a review of the way in which this request has been processed. Should you wish to exercise this right, you will need to contact us within 40 working days of receipt of this email.

If you remain dissatisfied on completion of the review, you have the right to appeal to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner and thereafter to the Court of Session on a point of law only:







Proposal for a new National Park in Galloway

I am writing to you to provide an update on the Scottish Government's commitment to designate at least one new National Park by 2026.

Following the conclusion of the new National Park appraisal process, I am very pleased to inform you that we are proposing to establish a new National Park in Galloway. I hope that this will come as very good news given the supportive role that you and the SOSE leadership team have played during the exploration and development of the Galloway nomination.

The proposal for a new National Park in Galloway has been laid in Parliament this morning and it will be published on the Scottish Government website following today's announcement: National Parks - Landscape and outdoor access - gov.scot (www.gov.scot)

In terms of next steps, a 'Reporter' – in this case NatureScot – will lead further work on the proposal, including extensive consultation and engagement with local communities, businesses, stakeholders, public bodies and interest groups. This will include engagement and consultation with the agriculture, forestry and other land-based sectors given their importance within the area. And of course it will involve significant discussion and exploration of the proposal with the three local authorities and other public bodies operating within the area. We would be grateful for your involvement and support with this next phase of work.

A new National Park in Galloway should take account of local circumstances and the views of local communities. It should deliver environmental benefits alongside economic growth. It should support the visitor economy and have a positive impact on people's social, mental and physical health. And it should be cost-efficient and contribute to the public sector reform

agenda, for example through streamlined governance and the use of shared services, expertise and premises with other public bodies.

The public consultation that takes place during the reporter phase will gauge support for the National Park proposal and it will look at specifics like the proposed boundary, the desirability of the area as a National Park and what powers and functions it should have.

The Reporter is required to provide its findings to the Scottish Government by 28 April 2025 and the report will be laid in Parliament. If we decide to proceed with the National Park proposal — with or without modification - secondary legislation will then need to be developed, consulted on and approved by Parliament in order to designate the new National Park.

I look forward to working together on this proposal over the coming months and I would be happy to meet you and Jane to discuss this exciting opportunity and to answer any questions you may have.

Proposal for a new National Park in Galloway

Following today's announcement by the Cabinet Secretary for Rural Affairs, Land Reform and Islands that Galloway has been confirmed as the proposed location of Scotland's next National Park, we wanted to set out the next steps and provide a date for a meeting to discuss any queries you may have.

As you are aware, last October communities were invited to explore and develop proposals for their local area to be considered for designation as a new National Park. The nomination phase closed on 29 February and nominations were received from Galloway, Lochaber, Scottish Borders, Tay Forest and Loch Awe.

An appraisal panel assessed the nominations against the six published criteria. The appraisal process concluded at the end of May and the appraisal panel's report has been published today on the Scottish Government website.

The panel noted that the joint bid from the Galloway National Park Association and the Galloway and Southern Ayrshire UNESCO Biosphere highlights the area's outstanding natural and cultural heritage

and it sets out the potential benefits that designation could make to the environment, the economy and to local communities. The proposal also provides evidence of support for a new National Park from local communities, stakeholders and businesses.

The proposal to designate a new National Park in Galloway was laid in Parliament this morning and it has been published on our <u>website</u>.

It is important to recognise that, at this stage, it is still a proposal. NatureScot – in its role as 'Reporter' – has been asked by the Cabinet Secretary to lead further work to investigate the proposal. This will include extensive public consultation with local people, communities, businesses, local authorities, community councils, relevant public bodies and interest groups. Consultation with the agriculture, forestry and other land-based sectors will be an important element given their importance within the area.

The public consultation will gauge support for a new National Park in Galloway and it will also look at specifics like the proposed boundary, the desirability of the area as a National Park and which powers and functions would be most appropriate. Ministers have been clear that a new National Park in Galloway should contribute to Scottish Government priorities — notably tackling the climate emergency, growing the economy and contributing to public sector reform. It should also take account of local circumstances and it should help to meet the needs of local communities.

The Reporter has been asked to provide a report to the Scottish Government on the proposal by 28 April 2025 and the report will be laid in Parliament. If Ministers decide to proceed with the National Park proposal – with or without modification - secondary legislation will then need to be developed, consulted on and approved by Parliament in order to designate the new National Park.

In order to discuss the next stages in more detail, including a presentation from NatureScot colleagues on the next stage, we are proposing that a meeting take place on 27^{th} August from 14:00-15:30 and we would be grateful if you could hold this slot in your diaries. We will be issuing an invitation for an online meeting shortly and I hope to see you there.

It was suggested at the last SoS team meeting that I should provide some briefing for your CEOs for this.

On reflection, I'm not entirely sure what this should cover, but here are some of the main things I was going to highlight in the presentation to complement the attached briefing paper we have prepared.

- National Parks are one of the world's iconic brands. But in Scotland we are using them as a tool to care for and invest in natural capital at a landscape scale.
- All of the National Park aims are about making positive things happen nature recovery; sustainable land-use, understanding and enjoyment (growing the visitor economy) and social and economic development of local communities. While conservation is hardwired in, this can only be delivered if all the aims are delivered.
- Our investigation of the National Park proposal is a means to test whether a National Park is the right mechanism at the right time for Galloway. It's not a done deal.
 Scottish Ministers will only decide on whether to proceed with designation once they

have considered NatureScot's advice in Spring next year

- If it went ahead, a Galloway National Park
 - would need to support the key land-use sectors of particular importance to the area farming, forestry, renewables, and tourism;
 - would need to work closely with its communities, land managers, local authorities and pubic bodies across the area;
 - is likely to be different in operation and approach from the existing two as a result of its physical, human and cultural geography
 - If a National Park is designed and run well, it will support a range of SoS strategies for social and economic development.
- As Reporter, NatureScot is undertaking an open, transparent and inclusive reporting process. Don't believe everything you read or hear!
- The formal consultation is now live extended to Feb 14^{th.} So far, we are satisfied with how the consultation is going with good attendance and a range of contributions across the public consultation events, circa 500 short or long surveys completed and a small number of household surveys returned. The format of the public events is being tweaked in light of experience with more emphasis placed on their drop-in nature but overall, though we are pleased with the welcoming, inclusive and participatory format and delivery of them by Out of the Box. 30 such events are now planned.
- We recognise the hopes, fears and passion on both sides this proposal has generated. In providing good advice to Ministers, we will provide a thorough analysis of all the views presented to us. We will need to take a view on whether they is sufficient support for the proposal to proceed or whether alternatives approaches should be considered instead. We also need to develop proposals which meet the conditions of the Act for Park status, including consideration of the special needs of the area that a National Park would be best placed to address.
- We are wanting a good response to the consultation and are particularly looking to all the REP bodies to respond to it whatever they eventual position

Engagement and Consultation Review - Galloway National Park Proposal



Who we are

Scottish Community Development Centre have been commissioned by NatureScot to provide an independent review of the design and delivery of engagement and consultation in relation to the proposal to create a National Park. This will be published together with the results of the consultation itself alongside NatureScot's advice to Scottish ministers in spring 2025.

SCDC are the lead agency for community development policy and practice support in Scotland. We produced the National Standards for Community Engagement in partnership with Government, public agencies and communities. These are good-practice principles which are widely adopted by public agencies and increasingly referenced in key pieces of legislation, such as the Guidance for the Community Empowerment (Scotland) Act 2015.

What we will do

NatureScot asked SCDC to review the work of the Reporter using the National Standards for Community Engagement to determine whether participants feel it been effective. Specially we are seeking views on whether:

- The process was in line with the legislative intent of the role of the Reporter and best practice in terms of community consultation in Scotland.
- Participants felt it was possible to make their views known in appropriate ways.
- Anything has been learnt in carrying out the consultation which may improve subsequent community engagement, should the proposal proceed to the next stage

How we will we gather evidence

The timescale for completing the review are from March to early April. Our emphasis is on the design and delivery of the work of the Reporter and not gathering additional views about the proposed park. We will do this in the following ways.

- A desk-based review of:
 - 1) the engagement and consultation phase of the reporter plan, including the promotional materials used; the design and targeting of online tools and face to face consultative events; and
 - 2) the approach to the analysis of consultation results and look at submissions by participants about the process itself.

- A small number of online key informant interviews and small focus groups to build on the desk research. These will also explore:
 - The design and delivery of the consultation methods, what worked well and what could be strengthened in any future engagement.
 - The experience of those taking part and the extent to which participants felt they were able to make their views clear.



I met recently with and and and and and and and and of Galloway and Southern Ayrshire UNESCO Biosphere to discuss a number of issues with the main focus being funding support.

As you will be aware, the Galloway and Southern Ayrshire UNESCO Biosphere (GSAB) was first designated in July 2012, and over the last 12 years has grown in both size and stature to the point where it now has a team of seventeen dedicated officers working across the region to support communities and businesses in their journey to net zero. Over the last few years funding from South of Scotland Enterprise (SoSE) has been a key catalyst in this development, helping to grow the core team and providing significant resource to raise awareness of the significance of the UNESCO designation in leading in delivery of a just transition to net zero. The success of this funding intervention can be seen by the raised profile that is leading to other organisations seeking to partner with the Biosphere in the development and delivery of strategic initiatives and to the interest shown both nationally and internationally by organisations who wish to learn from the best practice developed in the Biosphere.

The contribution that GSAB is making and can in the future make to the region's wellbeing, is increasingly recognised and valued and is reflected in the ongoing, multi-annual commitment that, even in the current difficult times, the area's three local authorities have made to supporting it financially. Their contributions alone, however, will not be enough to sustain the organisation's core team at the scale required to maintain the momentum now achieved. Without continued funding from elsewhere, therefore, the great strides made over the past few years are at risk.

The GSAB Partnership Board has always appreciated the need over time to reduce its reliance on public funding and to use whatever such funding it receives to lever in resources from other sources. GSAB is making strenuous efforts to diversify its income in this way and has already succeeded in attracting significant levels of project funding. But all initiatives of this kind have a significant lead-in period before they yield results. That caveat applies even to the bid for National Park status for Galloway that GSAB has submitted jointly with the Galloway National Park Association, which in any case proposes not a complete replacement but a complementary, albeit closely integrated, designation.

I understand that their current SoSE funding agreement is due to end on 31st March 2025 but they have advised there has been no indication of follow-up support and they are understandably concerned about the precariousness of their future should there be no follow up support. I am sure you will appreciate that prolonged uncertainty about future support means a greater the risk that they will lose experienced staff, have difficulty in attracting others and miss out on opportunities to raise money and to play a key role in joint ventures. Moreover, if momentum were lost at such a crucial stage, it would be challenging to regain the trust and engagement of the communities, businesses and organisations which are currently firmly behind the Biosphere.

I hope you will agree that such an outcome would be a great blow not just to the Galloway component of SoSE's territory but to the whole of south west Scotland. I would be grateful for your thoughts and I am more than happy to meet discuss with you how best it might be avoided.

Thank you for your letter of 5 June about the future funding for Galloway and Southern Ayrshire UNESCO Biosphere (GSAB).

We understand your concerns and those of the Board and team of the Biosphere in managing the uncertainty around future funding and how challenging this is for all concerned. We also recognise the value of the Biosphere to the region, demonstrated through the significant support we have provided over the last four years in terms of both financial and hands-on development support from across the South of Scotland Enterprise team which as you recognise has been instrumental in supporting the Biosphere in its development. When we entered into the five-year funding agreement with them, we made clear the importance of finding alternative funding sources and the team has worked hard with them to encourage them to look for these opportunities.

As you will be aware, the landscape around public sector funding is currently under significant pressure and in SOSE we are, in turn, subject to the impact of this pressure. As an economic development agency with a remit across the whole of the South of Scotland, we are having to make difficult decisions regarding our priorities and how best to use the resources that we have to maximise the impact they have for our region. Clearly, taking those decisions is an ongoing process and we are simply not in a position to confirm the outcome.

Where budgets might be affected with clients, partners, or stakeholders we are working in partnership with a shared understanding that this change affects us all, that it will require some adjustment to be made to the current plans, and that we must find new ways of moving forward together.

This is very much our aim with Ed and John and the team at GSAB and we will continue to support the organisation to adapt and develop given the current uncertainties and pressures around budget.

Re: your letter to Enterprise Agencies (12 June 2024)

As Scotland's newest development agency, and the first to be set up by the devolved Government, South of Scotland Enterprise (SOSE) has a tripartite focus on economy, environment and community.

SOSE is committed to a Just Transition to Net Zero and a Nature Positive future, focusing on reducing our own emissions and use of resources as well as supporting businesses, social enterprises and communities across the South of Scotland to eliminate waste and pollution, regenerate nature and instigate sustainable resource management practises.

Since 2022, SOSE has been part of a landmark partnership with Zero Waste Scotland (ZWS), to translate and amplify knowledge and expertise into a South of Scotland context. Our commitment to mainstreaming the circular economy for our region was demonstrated by the appointment of a Circular Economy Advisor in 2023. This one-of-a-kind role has been tasked with proactively driving understanding and uptake of circular economy to realise the distinct opportunities of our mainly rural region.

As with all SOSE does, national and regional strategies act as a direction of travel, informed by the voices of those across the South of Scotland with whom we regularly engage – most recently through our Summer tour – on how to get there. As always, our priority is to ensure everyone is empowered to come on the journey with us. This participatory approach was the basis of our 2023 Insights Survey, where we encouraged businesses to share their understanding on circular economy, including through 1–2–1 interviews. The findings have gone on to form the pillars of our circular support offering, recognising the need for raising circular literacy and appetite through simplified language and accessible pathways, with a clear business case – particularly for our micro businesses, which make up the majority of our region. Given SOSE's ambition to inspire, raising literacy began within our own operations: with all of our client-facing teams having now undergone circular economy training for working with businesses, social enterprises and communities to holistically embed circular principles into conversations and activity.

At the heart of our support remains the availability of tailored assistance for everyone we work with. The circular economy team alone has directly interacted with over 50 businesses since its inception in 2023, delivering bespoke projects across key sectors including textiles, food & drink, and within the creative economy. One example of this is our funding of the Galloway and Southern Ayrshire UNESCO Biosphere which has led to the recent launch of Merrick Blackface Knitwear. This project applies circular economy principles to turn an undervalued natural resource into a high-quality product with multiple benefits for the Wellbeing Economy.

Our team of experts across circular economy, energy transition, natural capital and net zero continually collaborate to align ambitions as a team and region. This alignment is further supported through the formation of a Net Zero Business Group, which brings together key colleagues from across SOSE's Directorates to co-ordinate our support and advice to clients on their transition to becoming climate resilient, nature positive and net zero organisations. Outcomes of this group will ensure SOSE has a formalised framework of tools and resources to integrate circularity, natural capital management and net zero into all that we do, including how our goals are defined, and funds allocated.

As an organisation, we are committed to continually developing and evolving our carbon emission data reporting to ensure we can effectively produce a more accurate organisational carbon footprint (year-on-year) and to continue to identify areas to reduce our Greenhous Gas (GHG) emissions in the year ahead. Our data includes reporting on waste, utilities and business travel, as well as employee home working. Our Board and Senior Leadership Team have completed the Royal Scottish Geographical Society Climate Literacy Programme to inform strategic planning and decision making. We have further supported sustainable activity throughout the organisation through continued delivery of Carbon Literacy training as part of the SOSE induction programme, leading to the accreditation of becoming a Gold Carbon Literate Organisation (CLO), alongside electric vehicle and cycle2work salary sacrifice schemes.

As part of the Borderlands Inclusive Growth Deal, we are heavily involved in several projects that are following circular economy principles including the Borderlands Energy Masterplan and the Natural Capital Programme, for which SOSE leads on the Data and Investment elements. These will enable us to develop a baseline for the quantities and quality of natural capital assets leading to informed decision making and responsible private investment in sustainable solutions to biodiversity loss and climate change.

As a public organisation, we recognise our capacity to influence change beyond our own operations to deliver local environmental and socio-economic benefits, whilst supporting a Just Transition to Net Zero and a nature positive future. We have established two funds to support business and community development, the Net Zero Accelerator Fund, now in its second year, and the new Natural Capital Innovation Fund. Our Procurement Strategy specifies how we will responsibly plan our sourcing activity to reduce emissions, contribute positively to climate change adaptation and embed sustainability at the heart of procurement. We have already seen benefits from this approach, including the use of repurposed furniture in fitting out the recently opened Hawick Business Centre.

Following South of Scotland's recognition as the nation's Natural Capital Innovation Zone (NCIZ), SOSE remains dedicated to our Just Transition to Net Zero and nature positive future. As an organisation we are committing to a net zero target for our operational footprint by 2038. We will look to plan our operational transition to net zero in the coming year by exploring heat decarbonisation and renewable energy solutions across our estate as well as continuing to support our employees with smarter ways of working to further reduce emissions. As a regional influencing body, we continue to actively engage with regional and national partners to address biodiversity loss, support our businesses and communities to develop circular economy approaches and Community Wealth Building opportunities

and implement the Regional Land Use Partnerships and South of Scotland Sustainable Forest Management proposal to deliver sustainable resource management.

SOSE views this approach as fundamental to unlocking the power of the regional and rural economies, building the industries for the future and continuing our focus on people, prosperity and planet.
